CANON SEMINAR NANCY SCHREIBER ASC ABOUT HER EXPERIENCE WITH THE EOS C700 FF ON 'A DISHFUL OF DOLLARS'

Go behind the scenes with DP Nancy Schreiber, ASC, on 'a dishful of dollars', produced in 4K with Canon's new EOS C700 FF full frame camera. Listen to the discussion between Nancy Schreiber and Tim Smith on making the film from pre production, production through post. Many features of the EOS C700 FF will be examined, including 5.9K RAW capture, true anamorphic support, faithful skin tones, wide dynamic range, filmic shallow depth of field, and ergonomics of the camera.

After the screening of 'a dishful of dollars' and the behind the scenes films from the Los Angeles based shoot, there will be a Q&A with double Sundance Cinematography award-winner Nancy Schreiber, discussing some of her creative thinking and processes.

Shot with the Canon EOS C700 FF - set to dazzle and to show off the Cinema EOS camera's on-set capabilities. After the screening there will be a Q&A session with Director and DP Jonathan Jones, where he will talk about Ember Films' creative vision for the post-apocalyptic film and how shooting full-frame helped them to make the eerie, suspense-filled and thought-provoking trailer.

The short documentary, shot entirely in a verité style, shares an intimate image of friendship and joy of life with a twist of humour. The film was shot on a Canon C100 camera with Canon lenses EF-S 17-55 f/2.8 IS, EF 50 f/1.4 and EF 70-200 f/4.
